
## **A Real Team Effort**

These volunteers give up their time and energy and are essential in keeping things running in a whole range of ways including fetching and carrying dry cleaning, sandwiches, cakes, moving cardboard and also administration. ## The Numbers

2017 has been a better year financially and we reported a surplus at the recent AGM, which is great news. This is primarily due to some new fresh food products (provided by volunteers) and some large donations from supportive villagers who responded generously to the concerns raised at last year's AGM. Our 2017 sales figures were:



Donations have been very important to us and we are grateful for:

£400 from the Church from funds raised at the Village Fete.

- The many donations from the village towards renovating the phone box including one of £200.
- £1850 from the Post Office Community Fund which bought new fridges and refurbished units.

Overall, the surplus in 2017 was £3487.

## **Funding Raising**

Fundraising continues to play an important part in the financial wellbeing of the shop. The Bangers and Bingo evening in November raised an impressive sum of almost £2000 and a very good time was had by all. The Christmas trees and Christmas Fayre continue to be firm favourites and were very well supported and made real contributions to our fundraising efforts in 2017. We look forward to some cracking events that villagers will enjoy and that will help raise income for the shop, in 2018
